

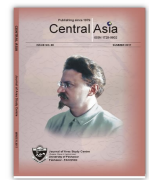

His two books (one International and one national), two chapters in international books (one from Amsterdam, Netherlands and one from Amritsar, India) and 26 research articles have been published at internationally and nationally recognised journals. He has organised dozens of international and national Seminars, Conferences and Workshops and participated in more than a hundred international and national Seminars, Conferences and Workshops. Three decades of research/teaching at post-graduate (M. Phil./Ph. D.,) level combined with several years' experience as Director, Area Study Centre, University of Peshawar, an autonomous institution of higher learning, has enhanced his awareness of modern trends in operation of managing such institutions as well as holistic understanding of issues in Higher Education. While student he has been an active member of academic community and served as General Secretary of Pakistan Students Union in Moscow. His Ph. D., dissertation written and defended at SOAS, University of London revolves around reforming system of higher education and its linkages with political thought and economy. He helped in Creating Higher Education Reform Group at Peshawar University: served as Core member of Open Forum for Higher Education Reform (OFFER); prepared Reform Package; published and presented before various bodies of Peshawar University in 2002-3, well before HEC embarked upon such efforts.
